- Eligible for cash prizes, course vouchers, college/university scholarships, internships

- District Fair
 - 1st Place \$300, 2nd Place \$200, 3rd Place \$100
- Regional Fair
 - Invitation to attend International Science Fair sponsored by Intel (2010 San Jose, CA; 2013 Phoenix, AZ)
 - Sea Education Scholarship; Onset Computer Award; Naval Science Award; Society of Women Engineers' Award
- State Fair
 - Be part of the top 400 high school students in MA
 - Over \$500,000 in scholarships and prizes awarded each year
 - During past 9 state science fairs (2009–2017), 24 Plymouth students have amassed a total of \$274,150 (average per student is \$11,423)
